Routines—why is it important?

As older kids settle back into a school schedule, it is important to remember that the little ones also benefit from a regular routine.

According to the article "Creating Routines for Love and Learning" from www.zerotothree.org, routines provide many benefits to children and caregivers. Through familiar routines. children feel a sense of comfort and safety that in turn helps them learn self control. When children can anticipate what to expect, they will have less need to engage in power struggles, promoting more positive behavior. Knowing what comes next will help children better cope with transitions such as going from home to preschool and bedtimes. Routines for greetings and goodbyes, as well as other social situations help children learn positive social skills, and responsible and safe behavior, making social

interactions more enjoyable for all. The article also indicated that routines and rituals can help "ease adults into parenthood", putting less strain on a marriage when couples are learning the often overwhelming tasks of being parents.

When children and adults have routines or rituals that help them feel safe, provide opportunities to "build self-confidence, curiosity, social skills, self-control, communications skills", everyday interactions become great times for relationship building and for learning together.

Early Literacy Activities

Popcorn Month—October

Popcorn rhyme (tune: "Are You Sleeping")

Popcorn kernel, Popcorn kernel, In the pot, in the pot. Shake it, shake it, shake it. Shake it, shake it, shake it. Till they pop, till they pop!



Popcorn art: Glue popcorn along the letter "P" to reinforce letter recognition. Have your child brainstorm other words that begin with the sound /p/.

Popcorn science: Collect different kinds of seeds—popcorn kernels, pumpkin seeds, sunflower seeds, etc. Sort them, describe the differences, show pictures of what the seeds will grow into.

Popcorn math:

Either using a microwave or popcorn popper, have children predict how much time will pass before the popcorn starts popping. Use a timer and show the children.

Read 1000 Books Before **Kindergarten**

Obtain a free reading log from the library for any child who is not yet attending kindergarten, or download the mobile



app "1000 books before kindergarten" by 1000 Books Foundation.

- For the paper reading log Cross off or color in 1 circle for each book read. It's ok to count a book more than once if it is read several times.
- There are 100 circles on each paper reading log.
- When you complete a log, show or tell the youth services librarian at any branch library how many books you have read. You can get additional logs to continue tracking.
- If you are using the mobile app for tracking, show a youth services librarian how many books you have read.
- Your child will receive a reward for participating and reaching these milestones at any branch library:

100 books, 500 books, and 1000 books read


