Senses and Learning

Did You Know?

Young children use all their senses to explore their world. Neural pathways are created and reinforced when senses are engaged, making learning easier and memory stronger. Think of smells or textures that remind you of someone, or something, or an event. Why are those experiences more vivid in your memory?

What Can You Do?

Give children opportunities to explore with all their senses. Help them with words to describe the sensations. Make everyday experiences a fun way to make connections to the world around them. For example, see the beautiful colors of the flowers? The colors attract bees, and the bees' fuzzy legs pick up pollen, which then help with pollination.

Early Literacy Activities

Letter Rocks—cut out magazine letters and decoupage/ modge podge onto rocks, or use a permanent marker and write on the rocks. Then create words with the rocks.

Story Rocks—draw pictures and modge podge onto rocks. Create stories using the pictures.


Sensory Rocks—fill a plastic container with different kinds of rocks. Have fun sorting, feeling, mixing, identifying, and comparing the rocks or stones.

Counting Rocks—write different numbers in each of the hollows in an egg carton. Fill them with the number of rocks that correspond to the written numeral in the hollow. For very young kids, it may help to draw dots in each section to help identify the numerals.

Painting Rocks—create patterns, words or creatures by painting rocks.



Read 1000 Books Before Kindergarten

- Obtain a [free reading log](#) from the library for any child who is not yet attending kindergarten, or download the mobile app “1000 books before kindergarten” by **1000 Books Foundation**. 
- For the paper reading log - Cross off or color in 1 circle for each book read. It's ok to count a book more than once if it is read several times.
- There are 100 circles on each paper reading log.
- When you complete a log, show or tell the youth services librarian at any branch library how many books you have read. You can get additional logs to continue tracking.
- If you are using the mobile app for tracking, show a youth services librarian how many books you have read.
- Your child will receive a reward for participating and reaching these milestones at any branch library:
100 books, 500 books, and 1000 books read

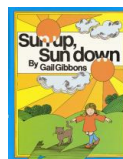
