



## Learning with Senses

Why do children put things in their mouth? Why do they seem to have to touch everything or ask questions all the time? Very young children learn about their world by engaging their senses. Babies who are developing control over their bodies primarily use their mouth to experience their world. Children who do not yet have much language skills primarily use their bodies to communicate and learn. Think about the time when you needed to learn something new. How did you do it? Did you say it out loud repeatedly to yourself, or did you write the information down and look at it repeatedly? Did you practice it by performing a task? Or did you use all of these strategies? Just like adults, the more senses children use to experience and explore, the easier it is for their brains to make connections that aid learning. For some children, play that involves certain senses can also help calm and focus.

#### What Can You Do?

Provide opportunities for children to explore with multiple senses. For example, if your child is learning about the alphabet, here are some ways to enhance her learning through sensory play.

- Sing the alphabet song while pointing to the letters.
- Sing the alphabet song as you hop along on each alphabet letter taped to the floor.
- Practice writing by tracing the letters with a finger in shaving cream, or finger paint, or a mixture of flour, water and food coloring.
- Create letters with different materials: Legos, blocks. paper, string, play dough
- Play with magnetic letters
- Read alphabet books
- Have alphabet soup for lunch, alphabet crackers for snack.

### **Early Literacy Activity**

#### Make a Weather Vane

www.pbs.org/parents/crafts-andexperiments/where-is-the-wind-going-try-a -diy-weather-vane

- Use a compass to determine which way is North, then write N, S, E, W on a square piece of cardboard.
- Cut a slit into each end of a straw and insert a cut out arrow and tail on opposite ends.
- Place a piece of clay or putty in the center of the cardboard, and stick the tip of the pencil into the clay.
- Use a pin to fasten the straw to the top of the eraser. Wiggle it a bit to make sure the arrow can spin easily.
- Take it outside when there is a breeze. The arrow will point to the direction from which the wind is blowing.

Through this activity, children will learn about directions, and how observations can give us information.

## 1000 Books Before Kindergarten

- Obtain a free reading log from the library for any child who is not yet attending kindergarten, or download the mobile app "1000 books before kindergarten" by 1000 Books Foundation.
- For the paper reading log Cross off or color in 1 circle for each book read. It's ok to count a book more than once if it is read several times.
- There are 100 circles on each paper reading log.
- When you complete a log, show or tell the youth services librarian at any branch library how many books you have read. You can get additional logs to continue tracking.
- If you are using the mobile app for tracking, show a youth services librarian how many books you have read.
- Your child will receive a reward for participating and reaching these milestones at any branch library:

100 books, 500 books, and 1000 books read


