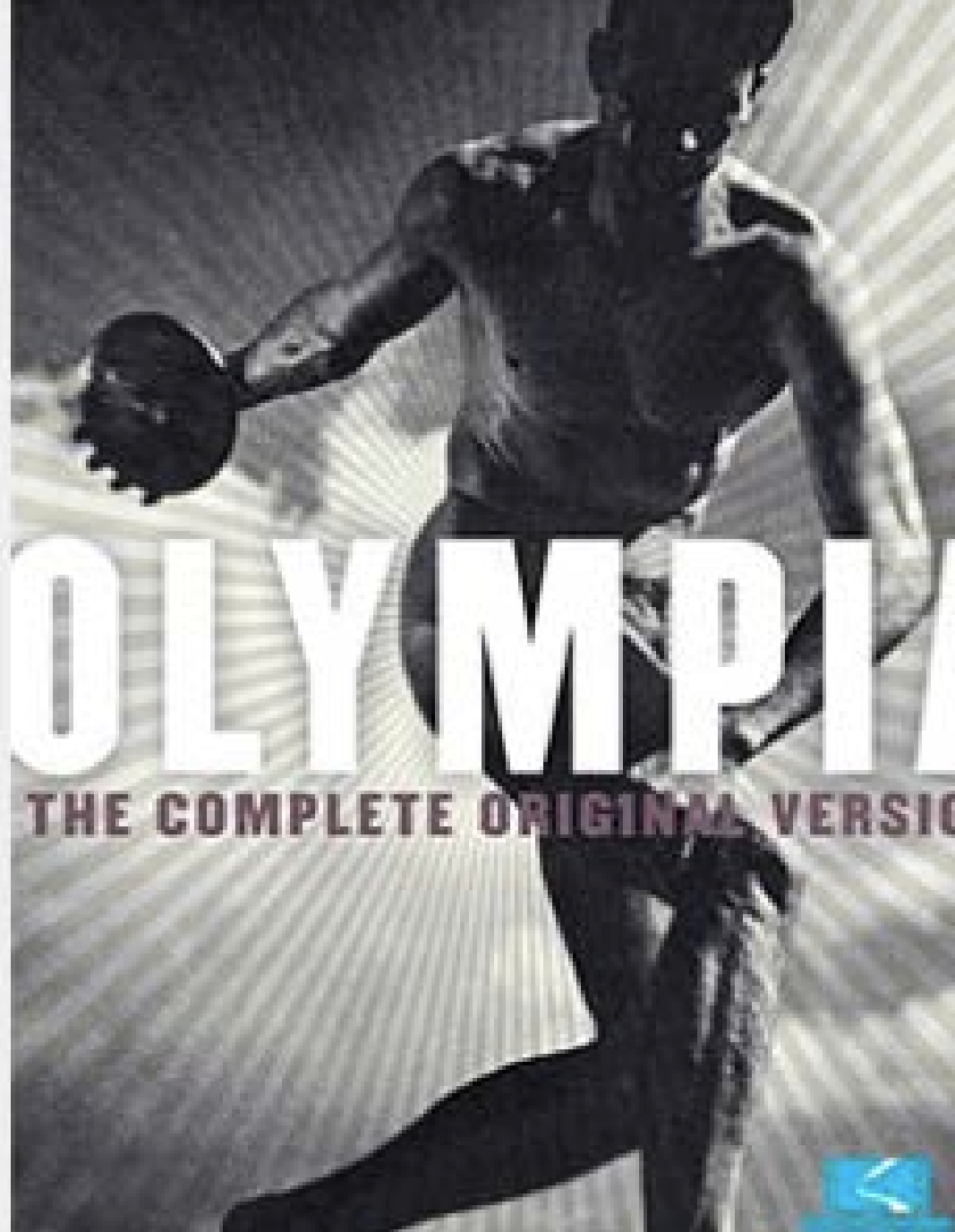

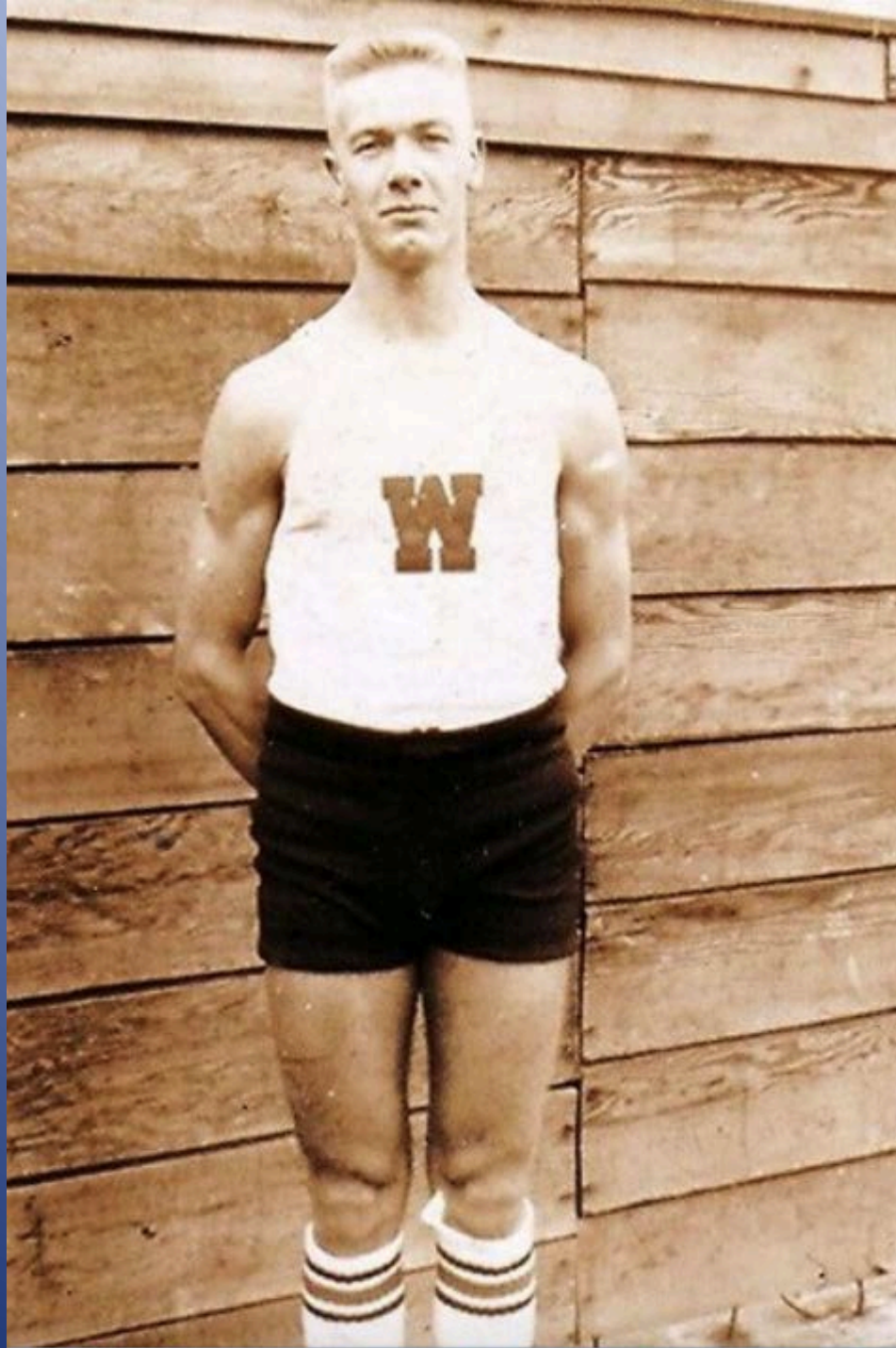








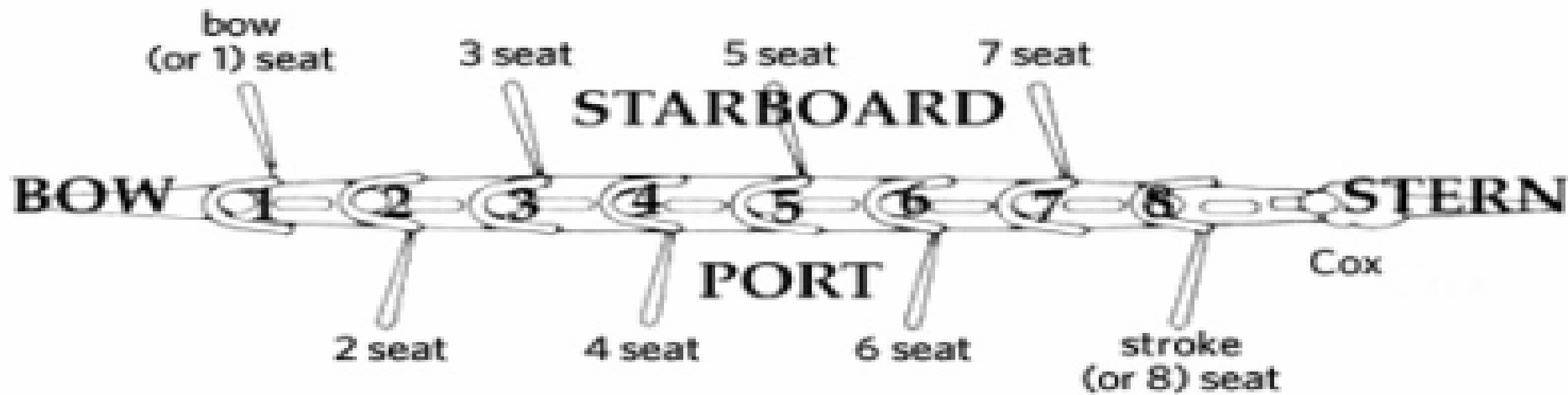

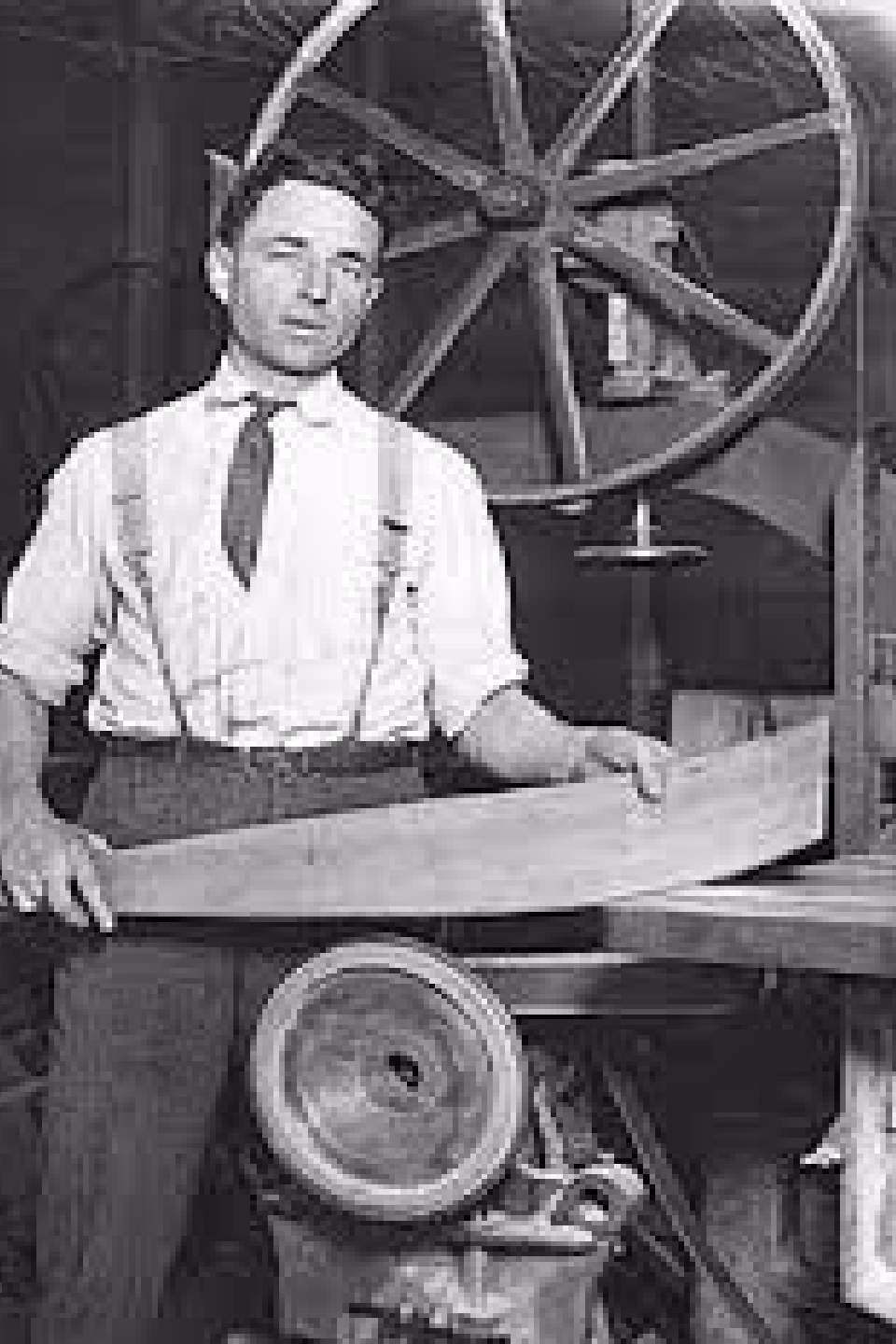


← Shell moves in this direction ←

Road to the 1936 Olympics by the U of W Class of 1937 Crew

- 1934 Rowing as a freshman they defeated California at Cal and at the IRA in Poughkeepsie won 1st place by 4 lengths
- 1935 Promoted to Varsity boat defeated California at Cal then were demoted to JV status and won at Poughkeepsie (Varsity lost)
- 1936 beat Cal on Lake Washington by 3 lengths then onto Poughkeepsie!

Winning at Poughkeepsie, they were on to Princeton
New Jersey where they **won the Olympic trials**
beating Pennsylvania Club, New York Club, and
California!

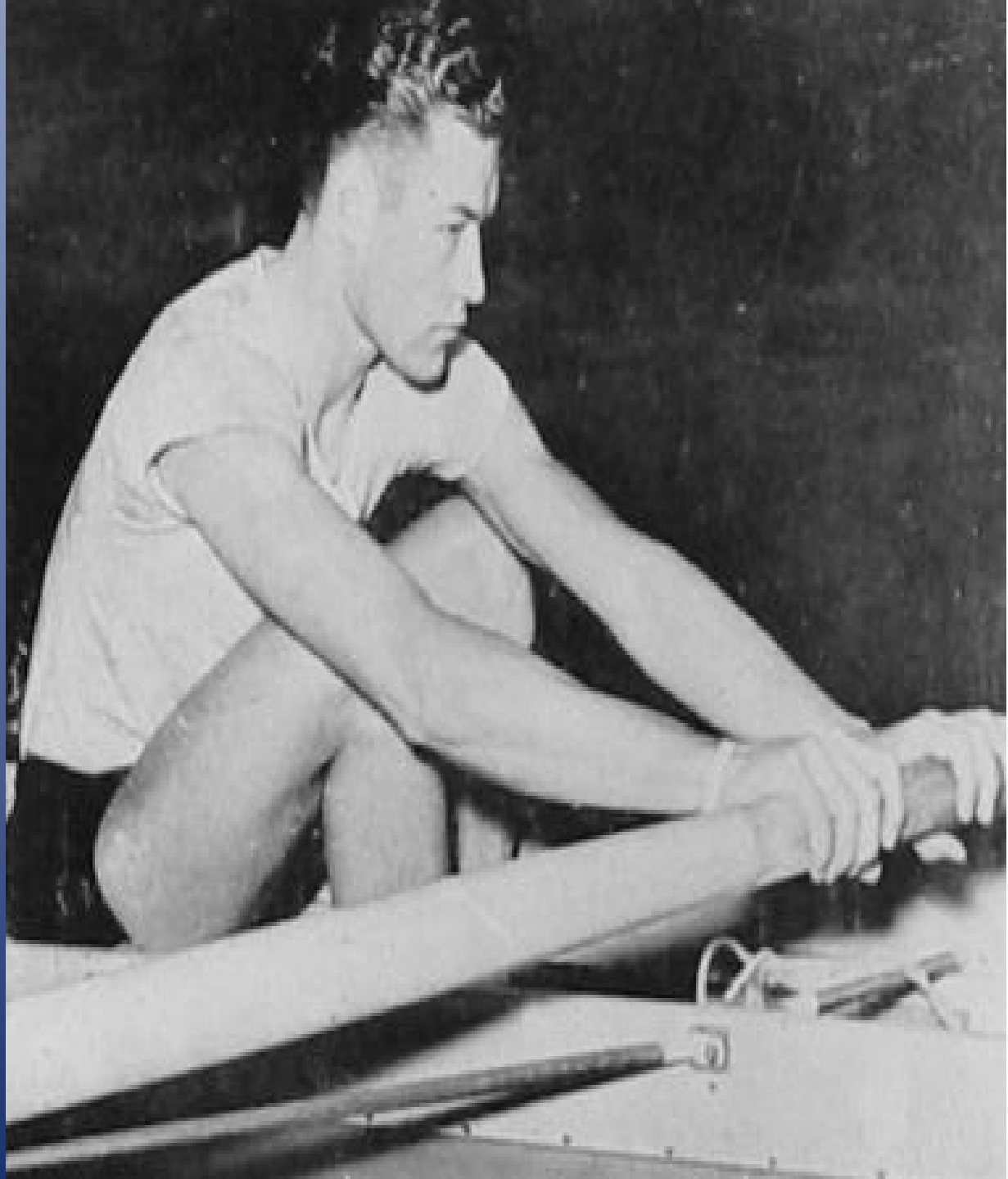

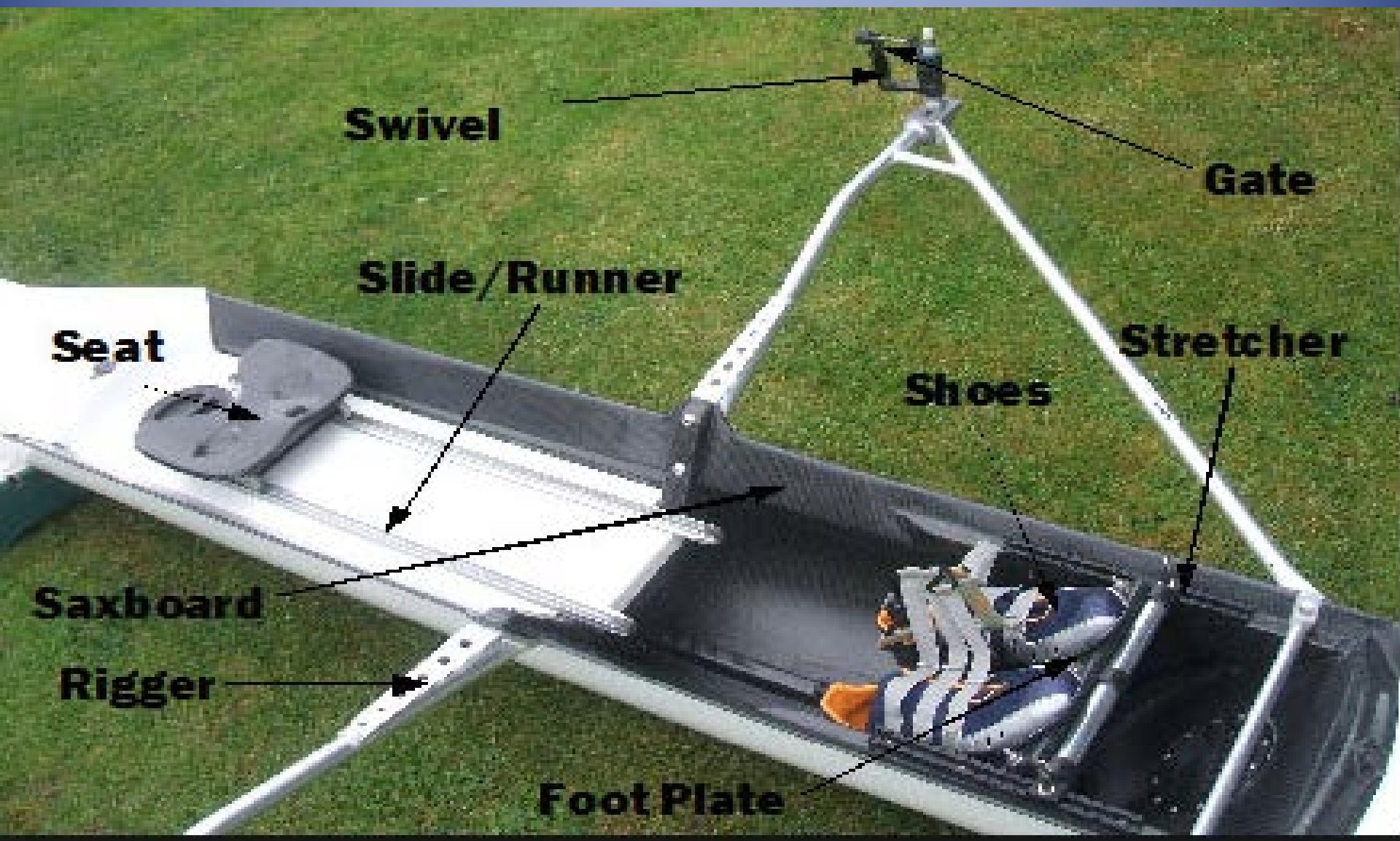
