

# What is the Caldecott Medal?

"The Caldecott Medal was named in honor of nineteenth-century English illustrator Randolph Caldecott. It is awarded annually by the Association for Library Service to Children, a division of the

American Library Association, to the artist of the most distinguished American picture book for children." (www.ala.org/alsc).

Among other criteria besides being artistically executed, the illustrations in the book being considered for the Caldecott need to be geared towards a "child" audience and be able to "tell" the story or carry the concept in an excellent way.

There are also picture books which are noted as Caldecott Honor books. These are Caldecott "runners-up" so to speak. You can view a list of past Caldecott Medal and Honor books at

# Helping children with literacy development

Kids who are familiar with how books work begin to understand that the illustrations in a picture book is telling the story as much as the words are. Some children can "read" a book through the pictures. While reading with children, adults can help children develop their language skills by asking questions such as:

- Based on the book title, what do you think the story is about?
- What is an illustrator?
- Who is the author?
- Tell me what is happening in this page of the book.

Parents and caregivers can encourage children to create and illustrate their own stories by writing the story with them, helping them to produce their very own books!
