The Blue Ghost — MARION DANE BAUER

Cool Cat, School Cat — JUDY COX

Eight-year-old Gus misses the dog left behind when his family moved, but then he meets a stray cat and a bossy classmate who breaks school rules to help him care for it.

Get Ready for Second Grade Amber Brown — PAULA DANZIGER

Amber is nervous about starting second grade with a new teacher, but despite being in the same class as mean Hannah Burton, things turn out just fine.

Mercy Watson Goes for a Ride — KATE DICAMILLO

Mr. Watson's usual Saturday drive in his Cadillac with

his favorite pig, Mercy, turns into an adventure when an unexpected passenger shows up in the back seat and Mercy finds herself behind the wheel.

Alien for Rent — BETSY DUFFEY
