Though scoffed at by Harold the dog, Chester the cat tries to warn his human family that their foundling baby bunny must be a vampire. Older readers, try: **Bunnicula: a Rabbit-Tale of Mystery**.

Wild Willie and the King Kyle Detectives — BARBARA JOOSSE

Willie and his best friend, Kyle, who has moved to Ohio, start a detective agency, and their first case is to spy on the girl who has moved into Kyle's old house.

Meg Mackintosh and the Case of the Missing Babe Ruth Baseball — LUCINDA LANDON

Meg follows a series of notes hidden in her grandfather's house to solve an old mystery of a missing baseball signed by Babe Ruth. The reader is challenged to interpret each clue before Meg solves it.

The Five Lost Aunts of Harriet Bean — ALEXANDER MCCALL-SMITH

When her absent-minded inventor father suddenly remembers that he has five sisters, nine-year-old Harriet Bean, who has never heard of them before, determines to find her unknown aunts so that the unfinished family portrait can be completed.



The Case of the Stinky Socks: a Milo and Jazz Mystery — LEWIS B. MONTGOMERY

Detectives-in-training Milo and Jazz join forces to tackle their first big case--finding out who stole the lucky socks from the high school baseball team's star pitcher.

Sly the Sleuth, also known as Sylvia, solves three mysteries for her friends and neighbors, all involving pets, through her detective agency, Sleuth for Hire.

When a confident girl named Princess arrives to spend a week at Roddy's house, she encourages him to help her investigate the suspicious




activities happening at a supposedly haunted house.
