



Alexander, Lloyd. **The Book of Three**
Taran, Assistant Pig-Keeper to a famous oracular sow, sets out on a hazardous mission to save Prydain from the forces of evil.

Bach, Shelby. **Of Giants and Ice**
Eleven-year-old Rory, daughter to famous parents, finds herself becoming a celebrity in her own right as she participates in the magical after school program, Ever After School.

Baker, E.D. **The Wide-Awake Princess**
Princess Annie is Sleeping Beauty's younger sister. When her sister pricks her finger and the whole castle falls asleep, only Annie - immune to magic - is awake and able to try to lift the curse.

Barnhill, Kelly. **Iron Hearted Violet**
Princess Violet is plain, reckless, and quite possibly too clever for her own good. One day she and her best friend, Demetrius, stumble upon a hidden room and find a forbidden book. It tells a story of an evil being imprisoned in their world.

Barron, T. A. **The Lost Years of Merlin**
A young boy who has no identity nor memory of his past washes ashore on the coast of Wales and finds his true name after a series of fantastic adventures.

Bruchac, Joseph. **Dragon Castle**
Prince Rashko, must channel the power of his ancestor Pavol the great, and harness a magical dragon to face the evil Baron Temny after the foolish King and Queen go missing.

Buckley, Michael. **The Fairy-Tale Detectives**
Orphans Sabrina and Daphne Grimm are sent to live with an eccentric grandmother that they have always believed to be dead.



Codell, Esme. **Diary of a Fairy Godmother**
Hunky Dory's interest in wishcraft over witchcraft gets her kicked out of charm school. Now she's determined to follow her heart and become a fairy godmother. But how to go about doing it?

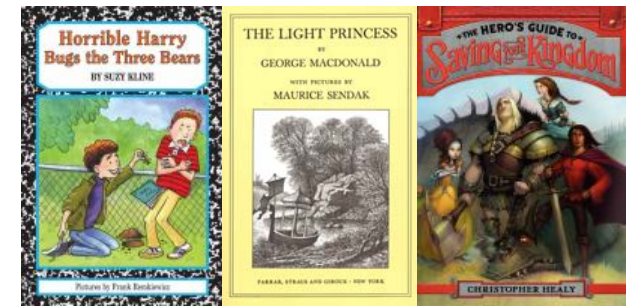
Dahl, Roald. **James and the Giant Peach**
A young boy escapes from two wicked aunts and embarks on a series of adventures with six giant insects he meets inside a giant peach.

Frederick, Heather. **Once Upon a Toad**
Cat is sent to live with her father and stepsister Olivia, but interference by her inept fairy godmother causes toads to appear when Cat speaks and gems to fall from Olivia's mouth, bringing them to the attention of jewel thieves and a secret government laboratory.

Funke, Cornelia. **Reckless**
Jacob and Will Reckless have looked out for each other ever since their father disappeared, but when Jacob discovers a magical mirror that transports him to a warring world populated by witches, giants, and ogres, he keeps it to himself until Will follows him one day, with dire consequences.

George, Jessica. **Tuesdays at the Castle**
Princess Celie lives in a magical castle which changes itself almost every Tuesday. When the king and queen are ambushed, it is up to Celie and her secret knowledge of the castle to protect their home from invasion and save the kingdom.

Gidwitz, Adam. **A Tale Dark and Grimm**
Hansel and Gretel walk out of their own story and into 8 other classic Grimm tales. As they roam a menacing forest, they learn the true story behind the famous tales and how to create their own happily ever after.



Haskell, Merrie. **The Princess Curse**
Twelve princesses suffer from a puzzling curse, and anyone who ends it will win a reward. Reveka, a sharp-witted apprentice herbalist, wants that reward. But her investigations lead to deeper mysteries and a daunting choice - will she break the curse at the peril of her own soul?

Healey, Christopher. **The Hero's Guide to Saving the Kingdom**
The four princes erroneously dubbed Prince Charming and rudely marginalized in their respective fairy tales form an unlikely team when a witch threatens the whole kingdom.

Kline, Suzy. **Horrible Harry Bugs the 3 Bears**
Harry incorporates his fascination with earwigs into the class productions of Goldilocks and the Three Bears.

Levine, Gail Carson. **The Fairy's Mistake**
The fairy Ethelinda rewards one twin sister for good behavior and punishes the other for bad, only to discover that her punishment is more pleasing than her reward.

MacDonald, George. **The Light Princess**
A young princess is cursed to have no gravity by her Aunt Makemnoit, a spiteful and bitter woman. As a result the princess is in constant danger of being carried away by the wind. *Illustrated by Maurice Sendak.*

Mass, Wendy. **Beauty and the Beast: The Only One that Didn't Run Away**
When you're stuck with the name Beauty, people expect a lot from you - like beauty, grace, and a sense of style. But what if you have none of these things - and you have a perfect older sister who really should have had your name instead of you.



McKinley, Robin. **Rose Daughter**
A beautiful retelling of the fairy tale Beauty & the Beast a Newbery Award-winning author. Beauty grows to love the Beast and through her love he is released from the curse that had turned him from man to beast.

Mlynowski, Sarah. **If the Shoe Fits**
On their second adventure through the magic mirror Abby and Jonah find themselves in the Cinderella fairy tale - and that is when things start to go really wrong.

Morris, Gerald. **The Legend of the King**
Sir Dinadan and his friends Sir Palomides, Sir Gaheris, Sir Terence, and other knights of the Round Table and their associates try to stop Mordred and his White Horsemen from ending King Arthur's rule of Great Britain.

Paterson, Katherine. **The Flint Heart**
When Charlie's father finds an enchanted charm, he's transformed into a cruel and merciless brute. Can Charlie fix things?

Pyle, Howard. **The Story of King Arthur and His Knights**
From the sword in the stone and the founding of Camelot to the famed Round Table and the Lake of Enchantment, the legend of King Arthur will never lose its magic. Though simpler, this version includes all the original, wonderful stories.

Sage, Angie. **Magyk**
Septimus Heap, the seventh son of the seventh son, disappears the night he is born. That same night, the baby's father comes across an abandoned child in the snow - a newborn girl with violet eyes. Who is this mysterious baby girl, and what really happened to their beloved son Septimus?



Snyder, Laurel. **Up and Down the Scratchy Mountains, or, The Search for a Suitable Princess**
Lucy, a milkmaid, and her best friend Wynston, a reluctant prince, go in search of information about Lucy's missing mother - even though Wynston is supposed to be searching for a proper princess to marry.

Staniszewski, Anna. **My Very Unfair Life**
Jenny, a professional adventurer, would prefer spending time with her friends over helping magical kingdoms around the universe, but soon she is given the choice to return to her normal life or go into a battle she doesn't think she can win.

Wrede, Patricia. **Dealing with Dragons**
Bored with traditional palace life, a princess goes off to live with a group of dragons and soon becomes involved with fighting against some disreputable wizards who want to steal away the dragons' kingdom.

Yolen, Jane. **Passager: The Young Merlin Trilogy, Book One**
A falconer adopts a boy abandoned in the forest and teaches him all of the things he's forgotten, including the boy's true name - and the legacy of magic that will be his when he comes of age.
