Judy Moody — MEGAN MCDONALD

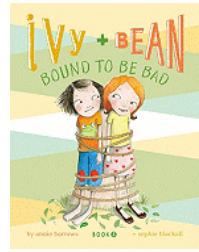
Third grader Judy Moody is in a first day of school bad mood until she gets an assignment to create a collage all about herself and begins creating her masterpiece, the Me collage.

Stink: the Incredible Shrinking Kid — MEGAN MCDONALD

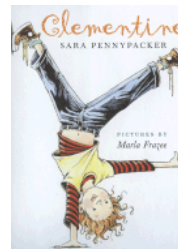
The shortest kid in the second grade, James Moody, also known as Stink, learns all about the shortest president of the United States, James Madison, when they celebrate Presidents' Day at school.

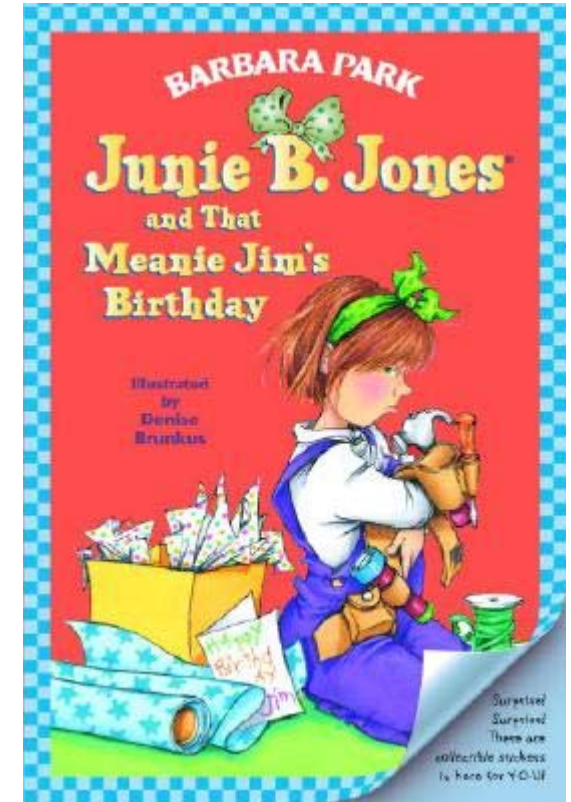
Not-So-Weird Emma — SALLY WARNER
