Hapka, Catherine. At First Sight

When Lauren meets the perfect guy at the planetarium, she feels like the stars have finally aligned in her favor. The only problem is she meets him in the dark and they never get a look at each other . . . or get each other's names.

Ives, David. Voss

Through a series of letters home, fifteen-year-old Vospop "Voss" Vsklzwczdztwczky shares his experiences as he is smuggled out of Slobovia in a crate of black-market cheese puffs, tries to find a job in an American city, and foils a sinister plot.

Jinks, Catherine. *The Abused Werewolf Rescue Group* When Tobias wakes up in a hospital with no memory of the night before, his mother tells him that he was found unconscious. At Featherdale Wildlife Park. *In a dingo pen*. He assumes that his friends are somehow responsible, until the mysterious Reuben turns up, claiming that Toby has a rare and dangerous "condition." Next thing he knows, Toby finds himself involved with a strange bunch of sickly insomniacs who seem convinced that he needs their help.

Kluger, Steve. My Most Excellent Year: A Novel of Love, Mary Poppins, & Fenway Park

Meet T.C., who is valiantly attempting to get Alejandra to fall in love with him; Alejandra, who is playing hard to get and is busy trying to sashay out from under the responsibilities of being a diplomat's daughter; and T.C.'s brother Augie, who is gay and in love and everyone knows it but him.

Lowry, Brigid. *Things You Either Hate or Love* A cynical, overweight, and lonely Australian teenager spends her summer vacation making lists, eating comfort foods, and trying to earn enough money to attend a big rock concert.

Lubar, David. *Sleeping Freshman Never Lie*Scott is the quintessential freshman. He's small, he's lost, and seniors yoke him for spare change. His honors homework keeps him up all night and his gym teacher is trying to kill him. He joins the paper, runs for student council, and tries out for the play, just to be near a girl he likes.

Mackler, Carolyn. *Vegan, Virgin, Valentine*Mara's niece, who is only one-year-younger, moves in bringing conflict between the two teenagers because of their opposite personalities.

Ostow, Michol. So Punk Rock (and Other Ways to Disappoint Your Mother): A Novel

Despite his dreams of hipster rock glory, Ari's band, the Tribe, is more white bread than indie-cred. Made up of four suburban teens from a wealthy Jewish school, their Mötley Crüe is about as hardcore as SAT prep and scripture studies. But when their band becomes famous overnight, he has to navigate a minefield of inflated egos, misplaced romance, and the shallowness of indie-rock elitism.

Pratchett, Terry. Wee Free Men

Armed with only a frying pan and her common sense, young witch-to-be Tiffany Aching must defend her home against the monsters of Fairyland. Luckily she has some very unusual help, the Wee Free Men, a clan of fierce, sheep-stealing, sword-wielding, six-inch-high blue men.

Rennison, Louise. Are These my Basoomas I See Before Me?: Final Confessions of Georgia Nicolson

British teenager Georgia Nicolson's humorous diary entries reveal the results as she finally chooses between potential boyfriends, but then becomes involved in a play with the one not chosen, further complicating her love life.

Rex, Adam. *Fat Vampire: A Never Coming of Age Story* After being bitten by a vampire, not only is fifteen-year-old Doug doomed eternally to be fat, but now he must also save himself from the desperate host of a public-access-cable vampire-hunting television show that is on the verge of cancellation.

Sachar, Louis, Holes

As further evidence of his family's bad fortune which they attribute to a curse on a distant relative, Stanley Yelnats is sent to a hellish correctional camp in the Texas desert where he finds his first real friend, a treasure, and a new sense of himself.

Shusterman, Neil. The Schwa Was Here

A Brooklyn eighth-grader nicknamed Antsy befriends the Schwa, an "invisible-ish" boy who is tired of blending into his surroundings and going unnoticed by nearly everyone.

Strong, Jeremy. *Stuff: the Life of a Cool Demented Dude* Fourteen-year-old Simon, known as Stuff, struggles with his new stepfamily, tries to avoid a giant attack rabbit, hopes to break up with his girlfriend and connect with a new one, and creates cartoons of "Punykid's battle with drooling dorkoids."

van de Ruit, John. Spud

In 1990, thirteen-year-old John "Spud" Milton, a prepubescent choirboy, keeps a diary of his first year at an elite, boys-only boarding school in South Africa, as he deals with bizarre housemates, wild crushes, embarrassingly dysfunctional parents, and much more.

Vizzini, Ned. Be More Chill

Badly in need of self-confidence and a change of image, high school nerd Jeremy Heere swallows a pill-sized super computer that is supposed to help him get whatever he wants.
