Types of Mis- & Dis-information

FIRSTDRAFT

7 TYPES OF MIS- AND DISINFORMATION



SATIRE OR PARODY

No intention to cause harm but has potential to fool



Misleading use of information to frame an issue or individual



When genuine sources are impersonated



New content is 100% false, designed to deceive and do harm



FALSE CONNECTION

When headlines, visuals or captions don't support the content



FALSE CONTEXT

When genuine content is shared with false contextual information



MANIPULATED CONTENT

When genuine information or imagery is manipulated to deceive

Be a skeptic, not a cynic

We do not need to be cynics and reject everything we hear and see. Instead, we need to be curious, ask questions, respect facts, and evaluate sources – trademarks of a good skeptic!



Bias

We are all biased

EVERYONE has bias. We must assume that all news and information has some degree of bias, just as we must assume that we as individuals approach everything with bias.



Agenda

Agenda is more important

Agenda should be your primary concern for quick fact checks. Agenda is about what a news or research organization is set up to do. Good process and good culture go a long way to mitigating personal bias.



Role of Emotion

Check your emotions!

When you feel strong emotion and that emotion pushes you to share a "fact" with others, STOP. Above all, these are the claims that you must fact-check.



Learn the "Moves": SIFT

- **Stop:** Ask yourself whether you know the website or source of the info and what the reputation of both claim and website is.
- Investigate the source: Know what you are reading before you read it.
- Find trusted coverage: When investigating a claim, look for trusted reporting or analysis of the claim.
- Trace claims, quotes, and media back to original context: Trace the claim, quote, or media back to its source so you can see it in original context and get a sense if the version you saw was accurately presented.

SIFT: Stop

- Ask yourself whether you know and trust the website or source of info.
- After you begin your search, if you find yourself down a rabbit hole, stop and take a second to remind yourself what your goal is.








Lateral Reading

- Look at what other websites and resources say about the resource you are using.
- Websites often look professional, may not have ads, and/or appear as nonprofits – this is not a sign of credibility.





Nature of Scientific Research

- Scientific knowledge is always tentative and subject to revision should new evidence come to light
- Results of scientific studies are often just a drop in the bucket - they are rarely a complete picture
- News media often make the conclusions found in studies seem more conclusive than they really are



The study's authors, Randall Akee of UCLA, Emilia Simeonova of Johns Hopkins, and E. Jane Costello and William Copeland of Duke, suggest that children's well being may improve along with household income. 
Bias in Algorithms/Search Engines


- Algorithms have bias, just as people do
- Search engine optimization
- Filter bubbles
- Confirmation bias



Confirmation Bias

Bad answers are sometimes the result of asking questions in ways that tap into the language or concerns of pseudoscience, conspiracy theory, or fringe beliefs.

Avoid Confirmation Bias in Searches


- Avoid asking questions that imply a certain answer
- Avoid using terms that imply a certain answer
- Avoid culturally loaded terms
- Plan to reformulate
- Scan results for better terms























































Reputable Fact Checking Sites

- The following organizations are generally regarded as reputable fact-checking organizations focused on U.S. national news:
 - Politifact
 - Factcheck.org
 - Washington Post Fact Checker
 - Snopes
 - Truth be Told
 - NPR Fact-Check
- Respected specialty sites cover niche areas such as climate or celebrities. Here are a few examples:
 - Climate Feedback
 - SciCheck
 - Quote Investigator
- There are many fact-checking sites outside the U.S. Here is a small sample:
 - <u>FactsCan</u> (Canada)
 - The Hound (Mexico)
 - BBC Reality Check (UK)
 - Channel 4 Fact Check (UK)
 - Full Fact (UK)



Evaluating News Sources

- "Newspapers of record"
 - They are rigorous, showing attention to detail and having accountability in their editorial processes.
 - They have a truly national view and attempt to be the best possible record of what happened in the nation (not just a region) on a given day.



Newspapers of Record

- United States:
 - The New York Times
 - The Wall Street Journal
 - The Los Angeles Times
 - The Washington Post
 - You could add in the Boston Globe, Miami Herald, or Chicago Tribune.
 - Or subtract the LA Times or Washington Post.
- Other English-language newspapers of record:
 - The Times (UK)
 - The Daily Telegraph (UK)
 - The Irish Times (Ireland)
 - The Times of India (India)
 - New Zealand Herald (New Zealand)
 - Sydney Morning Herald (Australia)
 - The Age (Australia)
 - The Globe and Mail (Canada)

Bogus Local News Sites

- Many fake news sites make themselves appear to be local news sites; e.g., Denton Daily or Livingston Ledger
- They plagiarize legitimate news in order to monetize it. Sometimes they also deliberately promote false claims and/or highly biased info
- These sites are capitalizing on two aspects of our current info environment:
 - the public's trust in local news organizations
 - the likelihood people will not detect bogus but legitimate-sounding sources of local news

SIFT: Trace

- The web often strips information of its context. In order to understand if something is being accurately portrayed, we must find that context.
- Trace claims, quotes, and media back to the original context.



Recontextualizing

- All of the moves (SIFT) are about getting the necessary context to read, view, or listen effectively. And doing that first.
- The moves reestablish the context the web strips away, allowing for more fruitful engagement with all digital information.

Summary of Strategies

- Intentionally read sources across the political spectrum
- Consult multiple sources
- Check facts and/or quotes
- Critically evaluate sources read laterally
- Recognize your own and others' biases
- Don't make yourself an easy target: avoid filter bubbles
- · If you have any doubts, don't share it
