

Imagination and Storytelling

Did You Know?

A little imagination goes a long way! Imagination is what young kids have in abundance. If we tap into this natural ability of theirs, we can help nurture their language skills by giving them opportunities to engage in storytelling in various ways—orally, through writing, or through play. This will help develop their narrative skills. the ability to retell a story or explain a situation or event, such as "what happened at school today?"

What Can You Do?

As you read a book or tell a story. explain how a story has a beginning, a middle and an end. You can practice with your child by asking what happens at the beginning of the story, in the middle and how the story ends.

Try some of these activities:

Picture story: Read a favorite story several times, and then ask your child to create a different ending to the story. What if the big bad wolf came back to the third little pig's house later on? Let your child illustrate the story and create their own book.



Puppets: using your child's favorite stuff animals or puppets, ask them to create a story about the characters.



Story Cubes—Draw a simple picture on each side of a dice that you create. Take turns rolling the dice and each person tells a story about the picture. As your child gains more skills in storytelling, see if he or she can

help you develop the story. One person rolls the dice, tells one part of the story with the picture on top of the dice, then the next person rolls the dice, and continues the story using the next picture. You can also create a bunch of cubes with different images, "throw" the cubes and then create a story with all the images on the top sides of the cubes. Word jar:

Ask your child for a few words, write or draw them on pieces of paper. Place the papers in a jar. Each person take turns pulling a piece of paper from the jar and creates a story that contains the word or picture. Each person's

story can continue from where the last person left off.



Stories without words: While looking at a wordless book, ask your child to tell you what's happening in the story based on the illustrations.

Read 1000 Books Before Kindergarten

- Obtain a free reading log from the library, 1 log per child or download the mobile app "1000 books before kindergarten" by 1000 Books Foundation
- For the paper reading log Cross off or color in 1 circle for each book read. It's ok to count a book more than once if it is read several times
- There are 100 circles on each paper reading log
- When you complete a log, show or tell the youth services librarian at any branch library how many books you have read. You can get another log to continue tracking
- If you are using the mobile app for tracking, show a youth services librarian how many books you have read
- Your child will receive a reward for participating and reaching these milestones at any branch library:

100 books, 500 books, and 1000 books read
