# Celebrate Día: Diversity in Action



El diá de los niños, el diá de los libros (Children's Day / Book Day) is a day created by librarians and educators as a celebration of childhood and bilingual literacy. It

emphasizes the importance of advocating literacy for every child regardless of linguistic and cultural background. The celebration is cross-cultural and intergenerational. In the words of one of the founders of this annual event, author Pat Mora: "April 30th has become a day for remembering the power of words and books in the lives of our young people and for honoring all the languages spoken in the homes of this country. One in five of our school children comes from a home in which a language other than English is spoken. By honoring these languages, we celebrate our linguistic and cultural wealth."

# Did You Know?

The ability to hear and play with rhyming words is a skill that will help children become successful readers.

Singing songs, nursery rhymes and reading books with rhyming words are some ways to help children learn this skill. Playing games that encourage children to find rhyming words is also a fun way to do this. For example, you can play the "I Spy" game by asking kids to guess an object that rhymes with a word—"I spy with my little eye something that is round and red, and rhymes with tall, what is it?" - a ball.

Another activity to do is to cut out magazine pictures of rhyming words, and have kids find the pairs of pictures that rhyme. Be sure to start with just 2-3 pairs and progress to more as your child masters the skill. Then kids will progress to finding joy in making up silly or funny sounding words to make rhymes, such as the things found in Dr. Seuss' Books.



## Read 1000 Books Before Kindergarten

 Obtain a free reading log from the library, 1 log per child



or download the mobile app "1000 books before kindergarten" by 1000 books foundation

- For the paper reading log Cross off or color in 1 circle for each book read, it's ok to count a book more than once if it is read several times
- There are 100 circles on each paper reading log
- When you complete a log, show or tell the youth services librarian at any branch library how many books you have read. You can get another log to continue tracking
- If you are using the mobile app for tracking, show a youth services librarian how many books you have read
- Your child will receive a reward for participating and reaching these milestones at any branch library:

100 books, 500 books, and 1000 books read
