Did You Know?

According to Maslow's Theory of Hierarchy of Needs, people's behavior are motivated by a hierarchy of needs. Current brain research finds that when these needs are met, a child is better able to learn. Of the series of needs on the hierarchy, "physiological and safety needs", and the "need for a sense of belonging and love" are the most important. Thus it is not difficult to see the important role that primary caregivers play in every child's life from very early on by providing safe shelter, food, and love.

Beginning in the mother's womb, good nutrition, good prenatal care, and a safe environment for the parent gives a baby a healthy and safe start. When a baby emerges into the world, his or her first connections with the world, including those with the people who surround them, form very important brain connections that lay the foundation for future learning and development. Reading and playing together are some ways that kids can develop a sense of love and belonging with his or her caregiver. The following are some book suggestions that encourage fun interactions. 

Early Literacy Activity

Literacy with Recyclables

Create your own little town by gluing recycled cereal boxes, or other small snack boxes onto a piece of cardboard to make "buildings". Draw in roads and other features such as a park. Do not cover up all the words on the cereal boxes or paint over all of them.

Help your child spot letters of the alphabet (A to Z) around the make believe town. How many can you find? For example, your child can spot the letter "C" on Captain Crunch, "o" on Cheerios, "T" on Tazo tea, etc.



Read 1000 Books Before Kindergarten

 Obtain a free reading log from the library, 1 log per child



or download the mobile app "1000 books before

kindergarten" by 1000 books foundation

- For the paper reading log Cross off or color in 1 circle for each book read, it's ok to count a book more than once if it is read several times
- There are 100 circles on each paper reading log
- When you complete a log, show or tell the youth services librarian at any branch library how many books you have read. You can get another log to continue tracking
- If you are using the mobile app for tracking, show a youth services librarian how many books you have read
- Your child will receive a reward for participating and reaching these milestones at any branch library:

100 books, 500 books, and 1000 books read


