# Move

#### Did You Know?

Moving our bodies is not only critical in building a healthy body, but it also enhances learning.

As a child's brain develops, movement helps provide the sensory stimulation to "prompt" learning. Through repeated use, the concepts learned then get strengthened by the creation of a network of brain cell connections.

According to the article, "The Effects of Movement on Development and Learning" (Child1st.com), "daily active movement that involves the whole body, balance, cross lateral movements (alternating one side of the body after the other), activities in which limbs cross the midline (reach right arm across the body to the left, etc.)" can "get the different regions in the brain "talking" with each other so that information stored in various places can be consolidated and used."

Movement can also help with the growth of body awareness and spatial sense. The development of rhythm, timing, balance, coordination, self expression, and language learning are also enhanced through body movement.

This understanding of the importance of movement guides the library staff in how weekly storytimes for young children are conducted, incorporating fingerplays, music and movement alongside picture books.

#### What Can You Do?

Give plenty of opportunities for movement in your daily lives, whether it is raking leaves, kicking a ball, stacking blocks, dancing around the room, or folding the laundry together.

### **Early Literacy Activity**

#### **Make Moon Dough**

Recipe from www.mommyevolution.com

- 2 cups flour
- 1/2 cup vegetable oil
- Blue food coloring
- Play tray or baking sheet

#### Directions:

Mix the flour and vegetable oil together with a fork. Depending on the consistency that you wish to make, add oil as needed. A firmer consistency will make it easier to form shapes like moon rocks and craters.

Add a sprinkle of blue food coloring. The coloring will not completely mix in, but it will create a sort of a sprinkle effect.

Place the dough in a flat tray or baking sheet. Kids can use vehicles, people or utensils to create a playscape. Encourage kids to:

- · create stories about their scene
- make letters or numbers with the dough
- pretend to write messages in the dough

## Read 1000 Books Before Kindergarten

- from the library for any child who is not yet attending kindergarten, or download the mobile app "1000 books before kindergarten" by 1000 Books Foundation.
- For the paper reading log Cross off or color in 1 circle for each book read. It's ok to count a book more than once if it is read several times.
- There are 100 circles on each paper reading log.
- When you complete a log, show or tell the youth services librarian at any branch library how many books you have read. You can get additional logs to continue tracking.
- If you are using the mobile app for tracking, show a youth services librarian how many books you have read.
- Your child will receive a reward for participating and reaching these milestones at any branch library:

100 books, 500 books, and 1000 books read
