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Art and Writing

Did you know?

Children need practice using their hands and fingers to do various things in order to develop the small muscles necessary for writing. They also need to see you using the written word in everyday situations to gain an understanding of what written letters look like and how it is used.

What Can You Do?

Provide opportunities to use tools that promote the development of small muscles in hands and fingers. This often involves creative art activities.

Activity suggestions:

- Create collages by tearing, cutting and gluing various materials.
- Cut with child-size scissors
- Build with small objects
- Glue with squeeze bottles
- Staple papers (children can do this by pushing down on the stapler with both hands while an adult holds the paper)
- Color, paint, or scribble with crayons, paint and brushes.
- Pick things up with tongs, spoons and forks.
- Play with clothespins, binder clips.
- Work with zippers, snaps and buttons.
- Fold paper origami
- Weave or lace with yarn and or paper



Early Literacy Activities

Matching mittens:

Cut out matching pairs of mitten shapes from various wrapping paper. Mix them up in a box or basket, ask your child to find matches for each mitten.

Ice cube painting:

Place different color food coloring in each section of an ice cube tray, fill up with water and let it freeze. You can have your child mix the colors to see how color changes. When it starts to freeze (around 45 minutes), put a popsicle stick in the middle of each section and let it freeze completely. When completely frozen, let your child "paint" with the ice cubes on paper. Talk about the process of water turning into ice and ice melting back into water, as well as the colors you see.

Read the book "Three Little Kittens" and learn the rhyme.







Read 1000 Books Before Kindergarten

- Obtain a free reading log from the library for any child who is not yet attending kindergarten, or download the mobile app "1000 books before kindergarten" by 1000 Books Foundation.
- For the paper reading log Cross off or color in 1 circle for each book read. It's ok to count a book more than once if it is read several times.
- There are 100 circles on each paper reading log.
- When you complete a log, show or tell the youth services librarian at any branch library how many books you have read. You can get additional logs to continue tracking.
- If you are using the mobile app for tracking, show a youth services librarian how many books you have read.
- Your child will receive a reward for participating and reaching these milestones at any branch library:

100 books, 500 books, and 1000 books read
