

Making friends—social development


The foundation for healthy social and emotional development in young children is formed when babies develop trusting relationships with the people who care for them. Cooing or crying to get attention from caregivers, babies are already practicing their emerging skills in engaging others.

As they grow into preschoolers, children extend their relationships to people outside of their family to include peers from playgroups, preschools and other activities. How they resolve conflicts, learn to take turns

Early Literacy Activity




Leave Collage

Cut out a medium size piece of clear contact paper, peel off the paper backing, leaving the sticky side facing up. Have children collect leaves of different sizes and colors, then place them on the contact paper. When the children are done, cover the work of art with

another clear piece of contact paper, trim the sides and hang it up. To make a simple frame, you can use colored duct tape to make a trim all around the art work.

For extra FUN: sort the leaves according to shape, size or color, and count them. You can also make leaf prints.
